Ordinance Review and Recommendation:
Ordinance 15-18

An Ordinance Amending Chapter XXXV (Land Use and Development Regulations), Article II (Definitions) Section 2-2 (Specific Definitions) and Article IV, (Regulations Applicable to all Zoning Districts), Section 4-1 (General Regulations) of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of Millstone, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey.

The Ordinance amends Section 2-2 and 4-1 by adding the definition of municipally sponsored affordable housing construction and by adding municipal uses to be permitted principal uses in all zoning districts. The Board found the Ordinance to be Consistent with the Master Plan.

MILLSTONE TOWNSHIP 2016 CURBSIDE SPRING CLEAN UP DATE: Monday, April 11th

- Maximum allowed per household 5'X5'X5' should be placed curbside no later than 6AM on Monday, 4/11.
- Hauler will have up to 04/15/16 to complete clean up, however hauler will only do **ONE** pass of each road.
- Appliances, such as: refrigerators, washing machines, dryers and dishwashers will be picked up.

Note: All doors must be removed from refrigerators and freezers.

No commercial contractors or builders!

ITEMS THAT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP:

- Items weighing over 200 lbs., rocks, stones, leaves, logs, brush, grass, slate, concrete, motor vehicles, motor vehicle parts or their components, tires, wheels, gas tanks, propane tanks, water softener tanks, treated wood, metal pipe, barrels, recyclables, hazardous materials or liquid waste. Wood and materials must be 4' or less in length.
- Electronic Devices: (such as Computer Cases, CPU's, Keyboards, Mice, Monitors, Scanners, Printers, Cables, Laptops, Peripherals, Televisions, Radios, Telephones, Cameras, VCR's, DVD Players, Stereo Components) can be dropped off at the Department of Public Works Garage Recycling Center, 899 Perrineville Road (Open Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursdays 11 a.m. - 3 p.m. and Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. - 1 p.m.)
- Wheels, metal pipe and barrels may be dropped off at salvage yards such as Beacon Metals in Freehold and Blewett, Inc. in Howell.
- Propane tanks may be traded in at Home Depot, Lowes or Ace as long as they are equipped to fill tanks. Outdated tanks, prior to 1999 with valves removed, may also be taken to Beacon Metal and Blewett, Inc.
- Hazardous materials may be taken to the County Reclamation Center in Tinton Falls by appointment. For more information call 732-683-8686.







Millstone Shade Tree Commission Got Mulch?

With spring just around the corner (let's hope), it won't be long before we look forward to getting our lawns and landscaping looking good for the summer. Fertilizing, lawn cutting, trimming and planting will be the priorities, but the final phase of making the property look great is always the spreading of a dark, thick, rich layer of mulch. So here are some tips to get you started.

Mulch is not the same as topsoil, nor is it the same as a chemical pre-emergent product. Mulch is made of lightweight, decomposed and composted green materials such as yard waste, lawn clipping, leaves, and small wood scraps. This ground-up and shredded mixture provides warmth and retains moisture for your landscape beds and trees. Of course the aesthetic quality is why so many use mulch over stone and other products.

You can purchase mulch in various formats. Bags are fine for small properties, patios and potted gardens. If you have a large landscape, you will find it most cost-effective to buy mulch by the truckload. About one cubic yard of mulch will fit in the back of a pickup truck. If you need 2, 3, 10 or 20 yards of mulch, you might want to have it delivered. The delivery truck will dump a very large mountain of mulch in front of your house or in the driveway. (Warning: This mound is highly attractive to cats and bored neighborhood children.)

For your adventurous types, you can make your own mulch in the form of compost with shredded leaves, bark, yard waste, grass clippings and vegetable scraps from the kitchen. Find an area in your yard and start your compost pile and remember to turn and aerate the pile.

Mulch isn't something you sprinkle lightly on the top of your soil. Like a blanket, it's all about thickness. The idea is to smother weed seeds under a deep, dark cover so they can't germinate. The ideal thickness would be 2 to 3 inches of mulch laid on top of your native soil.

Mulch keeps soil temperatures even, prevents evaporation so you water less and adds all-important organic matter to improve your soil structure and provide a feast for the earthworms.

Stone and rocks are not mulch. Putting rocks around trees and plants causes stress due to the stones heating up and causing water to evaporate quickly instead of soaking into the mulch and soil.

No volcanoes! It might look good but you are causing stress and possible disease by piling mulch high around the tree trunk. Keep it ground level at all times.

Mulch is now coming in a variety of colors and grades. Black, brown, red; organic or treated and single or triple shredded. Whatever you decide, follow some of these simple tips and happy mulching!




