Board of Adjustment 4-22-15 Meeting

Approval of Meeting Minutes: March 25, 2015

Resolution:

Z15-03 Riviere, Paul, Sr. - Block 9, Lot 9.01. Located at 720 Perrineville Road, consisting of one (1) acre in the RU-P zone. Applicant received variance relief to construct a single-family dwelling and pole barn on the property in Resolution Memorialized on 4-23-14. Lot is undersized for the Zone. Applicant returned to the Board 3-25-15 seeking and receiving an extension of time to 10-23-15. No noticing required.

Carried Application:

Z15-01 Raio, Charles - Block 35, Lot 3.33 located at 31 Cheryl Lane consisting of 4.75 acres in the R-170 Zoning District. Applicant seeks to construct a detached Morton Pole Barn, 45 ft. x 30 ft. where 900 s.f. is permitted for an accessory structure, the building will be 1,320 s.f. Applicant further seeks a variance for height where 16 feet is permitted, 19 feet is requested. Deemed Complete: 2-11-15 Date of Action: 6-11-15. Carried from 3-25-15 without any further noticing. Application approved as conditioned.

Planning Board 5-13-15 Meeting

Ordinance Review and Recommendation to the Township Committee: Ordinance 15-04

The Ordinance amends Section 4-9.11 regarding accessory building size restrictions.

The Board found the Ordinance to be consistent with the Master Plan. The Planning Board made a recommendation to the Governing Body to review the ordinance to consider architectural standards for detached accessory structures.

Ordinance 15-05

This Ordinance amends Sections 5-11.1 and 5-12.1 regarding permitted principal uses in the Highway Commercial (HC) and Highway Commercial 1 (HC-1) Zones.

The Board found the Ordinance to be consistent with the Master Plan.

Ordinance 15-06

This Ordinance Amends Article 15 regarding signage.

The Board found the Ordinance to be consistent with the Master Plan.

Ordinance 15-07

This Ordinance amends Section 4-2.1 regarding nonconforming structures and undersized developed lots.

The Board found the Ordinance to be consistent with the Master Plan.

Ordinance 15-08

This Ordinance amends Sections 5-6.2, 5-6A.2, 5-6B.2, 5-7.2 and 5-9.2 regarding permitted accessory uses.

The Board found the Ordinance to be consistent with the Master Plan.

Ordinance 15-09

This Ordinance amends footnotes for Section 5-5 regarding projections from a building into yard areas.

The Board found the Ordinance to be consistent with the Master Plan.

Ordinance 15-10

This Ordinance amends Section 6-2.4 regarding gasoline service station signs.

The Board found the Ordinance to be consistent with the Master Plan.

New Application:

P15-01 NAP Construction, LLC. Block 58, Lot 4.06. Located on Trenton-Lakewood Road consisting of 9.53 acres in the Neighborhood Commercial (NC) zone. Applicant proposes to subdivide the parcel into three (3) residential lots and one (1) commercial lot. Variance requested for commercial lot to have frontage on a private street and not a public right-of-way. Deemed complete 4-2-15. Date of Action: 7-21-15. Noticing Required. The Board approved the application as conditioned.





This program is intended to provide a safe, successful and enjoyable experience for all. To provide an opportunity to participate in a recreational program and experience the atmosphere where the emphasis is on building friendships, confidence, and self-esteem. This soccer program will be a skill based training program run in conjunction with the recreational soccer program. Each child will be paired with a buddy. Parents are required to stay, though not required to participate.

Each participant receives a T-shirt, parents responsible for cleats and shin guards.

Protecting Your Trees from Five Common Insect Pests

Your trees and shrubs have made it through a tough winter. They survived the cold, the snow and the hungry deer. But just when you thought it was safe, the spring and summer insects have arrived. Below is a list of five common pests that plague our local tree population; indicators to look for their presence; and how to mitigate and prevent damage.

Eastern Tent Caterpillar - In early spring these caterpillars build unsightly silk nests or "tents" in branch crotches. The caterpillars feed on leaves of host trees and may cause significant defoliation. Caterpillars wander when they are ready to pupate, crawling on houses, decks and driveways. Preferred host trees include cherry, crabapple and apple. *How to control: Prune viable egg masses on small branches December through March before eggs hatch. In spring, prune nests out of branches when caterpillars are in the nest, typically at night. Crush nest or drop in soapy water.*

Japanese Beetles - Japanese beetles are flying, metallic green bodied bugs with copper-brown wing covers. Adults appear from the ground where they began as larvae called grubs. Grubs destroy the roots of trees, plants, shrubs and lawns in the early summer. The beetles peak between late June through August and die off due to the temperature, but not before they decimate various landscaping. Preferred host varies, but include cherry, crabapple, linden and birch. *How to control: different life stages must be considered. Larval stage requires properly timed applications of soil insecticide, available at lawn & garden stores. Physical controls consist of shaking beetles off trees in the early morning. Use of pheromone luring bags may increase activity.*

Bagworms - One of the most destructive pests, these caterpillars make a cocoon in the clever disguise of a small pinecone. They start to spin their cocoon in the spring and homeowners finally begin to spot them in August, by then the feeding damage is obvious. These pests have a wide host range consisting of both evergreen and broad-leaved trees including leyland cypress, arborvitae, Douglas fir, red cedar, sycamore and willow. *How to control: Since young caterpillars are easier to eliminate, contact a professional for spraying in late May or June. Ask for non-contact insecticide products like Bt (Bacillus thuringiensis). These methods will not work on mature caterpillars. By the end of August and early September, the mature caterpillars are nearly invincible and your best option is to handpick the cocoons.*

White Pine Weevil - These pests start in larvae form and do their most obvious damage when they kill the tree leaders of white pine, spruces and occasionally other pines. Once they travel past the first whorl of branches it often results in death. When they hatch in adult form they are a reddish-brown with white-patched wing covers and a snout-like beak with elbowed antennae. The adults continue eating from the tree-tops and lay eggs in the damage, starting the process over. *How to control: Safely prune tree leaders below the discolored bark line that are reachable. Damage below the first whorl might be too late.*

Fall Webworm - Not to be confused with the eastern tent caterpillar, the fall webworm strikes in late summer and fall. It's webby nest looks similar in appearance however, these nests are located on the ends of a branch. It can often encompass an entire branch or be as small as the size of a leaf. Unlike the eastern tent caterpillar, these caterpillars do not leave their nest. They skeletonize and consume leaves within their nest. Many preferred hosts including ash, hickory, walnut, birch, cherry and crabapple. *How to control: Extract nest by hand, when reachable, or prune out. Crush nest or drop in soapy water.*

In many cases, birds and other beneficial insects may greatly reduce these pests. Attract birds to your landscape by hanging birdhouses and feeders, especially in or near affected trees. In the case of webworm, tearing open the nest will allow birds to gain access to the caterpillars. If infestation from any of these pests is extreme or trees are too large to access safely, contact a professional for the preferred biological treatment, such as Bt or a chemical eradication. All professionals applying pesticides should possess a valid pesticide applicators license.
