Z15-06 Szucs, Christopher - Block 9, Lot 9.15. Property located at 1061 Windsor Road consisting of 12.88 acres in the RU-P Zoning district. Applicant seeks variance approval for constructed accessory structure for height where 16 feet is maximum allowable height, 21.6 feet is requested; for minimum separation of accessory structure where 10 feet is required, 4 feet is proposed. Variance needed for Ord. Section 4-9.11 detached garage in the side yard or rear yard visible from the public street shall be architecturally consistent to the principal residence. Application deemed complete on 8-25-15. Date of Action:12-23-15. Noticing required.

New Application:

Z15-07 Meshki, Desiree and Michael - Block 14, Lot 15. Located at 840 Perrineville Road consisting of 0.526 acres in the R-130 Zoning District. Applicant seeks to install an in-ground swimming pool in the backyard where 15 feet are required for side yard setback and 3 feet can be provided; and the rear yard setback where 20 is required and 5 feet can be provided. A Message from the Shade Tree Commission



**Winter Tree Pruning
Golden Rule: Trees do not heal, they seal.**



Pruning your trees not only improves their appearance but also promotes their health. Pruning removes dead or dying branches that have previously been injured by disease, insects, mites, animals, storms and people. Winter is a great time to prune your trees because:

Better Access - the ground is frozen and pruning equipment can easily get access to your trees.

Better Visibility - without foliage, you will see structural damage that makes pruning decisions easier.

Between Growing Seasons - plants are dormant during winter. Fresh wounds (from Pruning) will only be exposed for a very short period of time - just until the spring, when new growth begins and new wounds will begin to be sealed.

Convenience - most landscape and yardwork is done for the season - so winter is perfect for pruning.

Here are the keys to good pruning:

1. Begin visual inspection at the top of the tree and work downward.

2. Use the 1/3 and 1/4 Rules of Pruning

- Never remove more than 1/4 of a tree's crown in a season.
- In reduction cuts (removing a larger branch back to a smaller branch), the diameter of the side branch must be at least one-third the diameter of the trunk/parent branch removed.
- For most deciduous (broadleaf) trees, don't prune up from the bottom any more than 1/2 of the tree's total height.
- Where possible, try to encourage side branches that form angles that are 1/3 off vertical forming "10 o'clock" or "2 o'clock" angles with the trunk.

3. For most species, the tree should have a single trunk. Identify the best leader and secondary branches before you begin pruning and remove defective parts before pruning for form.

4. Don't worry about protecting pruning cuts. Do not paint pruning cuts; healthy trees will seal the wound.

5. Keep tools sharp. One-hand pruning shears with curved blades work best on young trees.

6. For high branches use a pole pruner. A major job on a large tree should be done by a professional arborist.

7. For larger branches, cut outside the branch bark and ridge collar (swollen area). Do not leave a protruding stub. If the limb is too small to have formed a collar cut close.

8. When simply shortening a small branch, make the cut at a lateral bud or another lateral branch. Favor a bud that will produce a branch that will grow in desired direction (usually outward). The cut should be sharp and clean and made at a slight angle about 1/4 inch beyond the bud.





Diagram of proper pruning at the collar

RECYCLING

Official Notice: To Residents and Businesses of Millstone Township

Recycling is mandated by the State, County and Municipal Statutes.

Millstone Township must continue to recycle to meet aggressive recycling goals set by the State and County. As the Deputy Recycling Coordinator of the Township, my responsibility is to continue to strive to meet those goals by aggressively enforcing Township ordinances. Random inspections within the Township resulted in citations being issued for lack of compliance with Chapter 19, SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT, of the Revised General Ordinances, Township of Millstone. Some brief passages from this section follow:

"It shall be mandatory for all persons, who are owners, lessees, or occupants of residential property, to separate newspapers, glass bottles and jars, tin and bi-metal cans, plastic containers, aluminum cans, corrugated cardboard and electronics as hereafter defined from all other solid waste produced by such residence for collection and ultimate recycling of materials.

Solid waste: Solid waste shall mean and include all garbage and rubbish normally produced by the occupants of commercial, industrial and residential property and disposed of by private or public pick-up.

Proof of collection service: Proof of collection service shall mean a written record, log, bill or document evidencing receipt of service for the collection of solid waste for the preceding month from a person lawfully engaging in private solid waste collection services within the Township.

Violations and penalties: Any person, firm or corporation who violates or neglects to comply with any provision of this section or any rule or regulation promulgated pursuant thereto, shall be liable to the penalty stated in Chapter I, Section 1-5. (Fines could be as much as \$2,000.00 for non-compliance).

Note: Court appearance may be required for summons.

I urge you to continue to do your part in keeping Millstone Township clean and to show that we are an "Environmentally Concerned Community".


BOTTLES & CANS

Aluminum Cans. DO NOT INCLUDE; FOIL, PIE TINS, TRAYS, COOKWARE
Tin & Bi-Metal Cans
Glass Bottles & Jars. DO NOT INCLUDE; DISHWARE, LIGHT BULBS, CERAMICS, WINDOW GLASS
Plastic. #1 #2 Plastic Only
Be careful to completely empty any container. Any leftover chemicals in containers can be disposed (call 732-683-8686 for appointment) at the Household Hazardous Waste Facility



NEWSPAPERS

Newspapers and any inserts that come with the paper.
DO NOT INCLUDE ANY NEWSPAPER USED FOR PET WASTE OR HOUSEHOLD PROJECTS



CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

Waffle section between layers. DO NOT INCLUDE: FOOD CONTAMINATED CARDBOARD (e.g. pizza boxes) OR WAXED CARDBOARD. Break down boxes.



MIXED PAPER

Includes: letterhead, colored and white paper, junk mail, soft cover books, chip-board (e.g. cereal boxes). DO NOT INCLUDE: FOOD WRAPPERS, PAPER CUPS OR PLATES OR ANY OTHER PRODUCT USED FOR FOOD OR PERSONAL HYGIENE. NO HARDCOVER BOOKS (UNLESS COVER & BINDER IS REMOVED)



LEAVES AND GRASS CLIPPINGS

DO NOT DISPOSE WITH HOUSEHOLD TRASH. Grass clippings can be left on the lawn, added to compost piles, or brought to special drop-off at county landfill (for a fee)



CAR BATTERIES & MOTOR OIL-RECHARGEABLE & BUTTON BATTERIES

Car batteries can be brought to a scrap yard. Motor oil can be brought to the County HHW facility or local service stations. Most common household batteries (A, AA, AAA, C, D, 9 Volt) can be disposed in regular trash. However, rechargeable batteries should be brought to retail store drop offs (check www.rbrc for locations), and silver "button batteries" should be returned to retail or county sponsored drop offs



GIVE YOUR HEATER SOME SPACE



Space heaters are a great way to warm up a cold room or provide supplemental heat to your home. But while convenient, they are also a leading cause of home fires during the winter months. If you're going to use a space heater, here are a few tips to make sure you stay extra warm - and safe.

Do's

- Use only equipment that is made for home heating. Use all types of heaters carefully and follow all directions for safe use.
- Use a space heater that has been tested to the latest safety standards and has been certified by a nationally recognized laboratory. These heaters have the most up-to-date safety features. Older space heaters may not meet newer safety standards.
- Place the heater on a level, hard, nonflammable surface, such as a ceramic tile floor.
- Make sure space heaters are at least three feet away from bedding, drapes, furniture and other flammable materials.
- Place smoke alarms on every level of your home, outside of sleeping areas and inside each bedroom.
- Utilize a carbon monoxide detector.

Don'ts

- Never leave a space heater on when you go to sleep.
- Don't place a space heater close to any sleeping person, bedding, furniture, drapes or other flammable materials.
- Never use gasoline in a kerosene space heater, as even small amounts of gasoline mixed with kerosene can increase the risk of fire.
- Never use your oven, grill or clothes dryer to heat your home. This could cause a fire or dangerous carbon monoxide gas, which produces deadly, odorless, colorless fumes.
